

Fr. Vince Beuzer, other Jesuits leave rich legacy

r. Vincent J. "Vince" Beuzer, S.J., has been a Jesuit for 65 years. He has spent the last twenty-four of those years serving people at Holy Spirit Center. When Fr. Beuzer says goodbye to the

Center this July, he will add to an amazingly rich legacy of service to the Center, begun in 1973 by his fellow priests of the Society of Jesus.

Like the Jesuits before him who shared their considerable gifts with the Center, Fr. Beuzer's hard work, prayer and great faith helped lay and strengthen the foundation for adult faith formation and lay ministry in the Archdiocese of Anchorage. This August, an Anchorage-based diocesan priest, Fr. Dan Hebert will

begin helping Holy Spirit Center continue its mission and unique ministry.

Fr. Beuzer became Executive Director of Holy Spirit Retreat House (renamed Holy Spirit Center in 1997) on September 8, 1986. He succeeded the first director, Fr. Vince P. Kelliher, S.J. When Fr. Paul B. Macke, S.J followed Fr. Beuzer as director in 1998, Fr. Beuzer remained at the Center, offering spiritual direction, the Sacraments and ministry programs, including leading

retreats. His focus has been to help those seeking to find God in all things.

"The challenges at Holy Spirit Center have been many," Fr. Beuzer says, "managing personnel, finances,

building maintenance, and, of course, spiritual ministry. I have learned to trust in God's presence and timing. I have learned of prayer and discernment of spirits (good and evil) at work in the inner life of persons. I have learned the power of prayer in Jesus' Name. I have also learned to interpret better how God and Satan are at work within each of us and how to help others to respond to these spiritual forces.

Fr. Beuzer is planning the next phase in his life. "I see the


great need for an Apostolate of Healing," he says, "and I would like to participate in that work."

Fr. Beuzer has impacted tremendously the work of Holy Spirit Center and the Archdiocese of Anchorage. He will be missed by all who know him, especially those who have been transformed by his witness, spiritual counsel, and daily walk with Jesus Christ.


Fascinating Reads

The weekend includes conferences, quiet time for reflection and rest, sharing, a healing service and the opportunity to participate in 12 Step meetings. Fee is \$185 for single occupancy, \$165 for double occupancy, \$145 for commuters, and includes meals. Partial scholarships are available.
